

The Seventeenth Annual McCallum Bagpipes & MidWest Pipe Band Association United States Silver Medal Piobaireachd Competition will be held January 18, 2019, at the Marriott-Country Club Plaza, in Kansas City. The contest will begin at approximately 8:00 a.m.

The McCallum & MWPBA Silver Medal (USA), 2.5 inches (6.5 cm) in diameter featuring the ancient MacCrimmon piper and "MidWest Pipe Band Association" on the obverse, and the MHAF logo on the reverse, will be awarded to the day's champion in Piobaireachd. Prize moneys include First winning USD \$500 through Fifth \$100. The Silver Medal Champion will also be awarded a set of Duncan MacRae Bagpipes (developed by Stuart Liddell and McCallum Bagpipes), courtesy of Kenny MacLeod and McCallum Bagpipes, with runners-up receiving McCallum McC² pipe chanters. Open to pipers professional/open by their regional pipe band associations, the piper must submit four tunes of their own choice; Competitors will be notified of the selected tune prior to entering the final tuning-room.



Ian K. MacDonald

Ian began playing at the age of eight years old and was taught by his father, P/M John MacDonald.

At thirteen he received piobaireachd instruction from Jim McGillivray. That same year he joined the Toronto Police Pipe Band where he has remained a member, eventually taking over as Pipe Major from his father in 1996. In 2016 Ian became the twelfth piper in history to win the "Double" Gold medal in Piobaireachd at Oban and Inverness.

Colin MacLellan

Colin MacLellan is the Chairman of the Solo Piping Judges Association. Starting as Pipe Major of the 1986 Grade 4 Glengarry Pipe Band, he led the band to the 1996 Grade 2 North American and US Championships; the band was promoted to Grade 1 the following year. He was appointed Pipe Major of Edinburgh's storied Lothian and Borders Police Pipe Band in 1999, serving to 2004. Colin won the Gold Medal at the Northern Meeting in 1982, consecutive MacCrimmon Silver Chanters in 1990 and 1991, and the Gold Medal at the Argyllshire Gathering in 1992. He served as President of the Competing Pipers Association from 1999 – 2004, and is featured on Lismor Recordings' "World's Greatest Pipers" volume 11. He is a member of the Spirit of Scotland Pipe Band.

Fred Morrison

Fred Morrison has carved an international reputation with a highly improvisational style, combining the Gaelic piping tradition with contemporary and eclectic influences. One of the few pipers achieving success in both the competitive piping and folk music scenes, Fred is a master of the Highland pipes and the bellows-blown Lowland or Border pipes, as well as playing Irish uillean pipes and low whistle. His prowess on the Great Highland Bagpipe gained him honors in the exacting Scottish competition piping circuit, including the Gold Medals at Oban and Inverness, while he has taken the prestigious Macallan trophy at Brittany's Lorient Celtic Festival seven times.



Ken Eller (Qualifying Round)

Ken Eller, also known as "The Captain", has had a 50 year piping career... 15 times a winner of the North American Pipe Band Championships with two bands: the 78th Fraser Highlanders and the Clan MacFarlane Pipe Band. He is now retired from active competition and has expanded his teaching career with on line lessons. In 2005 he was accepted by the Royal Scottish Pipe Band Association (RSPBA) to their panel as an international adjudicator.

Roddy MacDonald (Qualifying Round)

Originally from Inverness, Scotland, Roddy MacDonald now resides in Japan and is a professional Piper. Roddy retired earlier this year as the longest serving Pipe Major for the Queensland Police Service Pipe Band (Australia).

One of the most renowned bagpipe music composers of the modern era, his compositions have been played by Simon Fraser University, Inveraray & District, Shotts & Dykehead, Field Marshal Montgomery, Vale of Atholl, Boghall & Bathgate, and Scottish Power. Roddy is an Approved Light Music Judge on the Solo Piping Judges Association panel.

Richard Parkes, MBE (Qualifying Round)

Richard has been Pipe Major of 11-time World Champion Field Marshal Montgomery Pipe Band since 1981, making history by leading FMM to become the most successful pipe band ever to come from Northern Ireland. Richard was honored with an MBE from Her Majesty The Queen in 2004 for recognition of his services to pipe band music in Northern Ireland. Although Richard has always put the band first, he also managed to win 7 All Ireland Senior Solo Championships, eight Northern Ireland Piper of the Year titles, nine Ulster Senior Championships, as well as winning the Strachan in London, the Jig in Inverness and a number of other prizes at major solo competitions. Piobaireachd at Oban and Inverness.

Stuart Liddell (Final Round)

Stuart Liddell, from Inveraray, has won almost every major solo piping prize possible, including the Gold Medal, Bratach Gorm, Donald MacDonald Quaich, Silver Star, Senior Piobaireachd, Clasp, and Glenfiddich Piping Championship. In 2017, Stuart became only the 2nd piper in history to have won both The Clasp at the Northern Meeting and take a Grade 1 band to victory as Pipe Major at the World Pipe Band Championships.

Colin MacLellan (Final Round)

Colin MacLellan is the Chairman of the Solo Piping Judges Association. Starting as Pipe Major of the 1986 Grade 4 Glengarry Pipe Band, he led the band to the 1996 Grade 2 North American and US Championships; the band was promoted to Grade 1 the following year. 



Jack Lee is Pipe Sergeant of the six-time World Champion Simon Fraser University Pipe Band, in Vancouver, British Columbia. Featured on Lismor's "World's Greatest Pipers" volume 15, he's won the Gold Medal and Clasp at Inverness, and the Gold Medal and Senior Piobaireachd at Oban. Jack won the overall prize at the 2017 Glenfiddich and was recognized as "Piper of the Year" by pipesdrums.com.

Murray Blair (Grade 2)

Murray's family immigrated from Scotland to Australia in the 1940's. Murray played with the Victoria Police Pipe Band, including performing on the recordings "Uphold the Right," "Live in Ireland," "Live in the Rockies (USA)" and "Masterblasters."

The Victoria Police Pipe Band won the Grade 1 World Pipe Band Championships in 1998, and Murray also released his piping book 'Philharmonic'. Six of the nine tunes played by the Victoria Police at the 1998 World Championships were written by Murray. In Australia, he won the Silver Medal Piobaireachd at the RU Brown competition. He maintained involvement in the local piping community and a founding member of the Victorian Pipers Association, an organization dedicated to teaching and fostering piping.

Terry Lee (Grade 3)

Pipe Major Terry Lee is one of the most prominent and successful pipe band leaders in the world. Under his direction, the SFU Pipe Band captured the World Pipe Band Championship of 1995, 1996, 1999, 2001, 2008 and 2009, and is one of only two bands in history to win both the Medley and MSR events at the World Championships more than once (MSR five times, Medley five times). Terry is also one of only seven Pipe Majors to win the World Championship more than twice.



Stephen Creighton (Qualifying Round)

Stephen Creighton is the lead drummer of the 2010 World Pipe Band Champion St. Laurence O'Toole Pipe Band. His honors include the 1989 World Junior Champion, 19 World Solo Finals, 5 Senior all Ireland Championships and 3 Ulster Senior Championships. With his corps, Stephen has won five Grade 1 all Ireland drumming prizes and World Grade 1 Drumming prize in 2015 and 2016.

Steven McWhirter (Qualifying Round)

Steven McWhirter is a native of Northern Ireland and now resides in Falkirk, Scotland. He has won the Adult World Solo Drumming Championships on eight occasions, including 2017. He is a full time drumming instructor with the Edinburgh Academy & Dollar Academy Pipe Bands. He is the leading drummer of the 2017 World Pipe Band Champions Inveraray and District Pipe Band.

Jim Sim (Qualifying Round)

Jim started drumming lessons with his Father at the age of 8. His first band was the Stock Yard Kilty Band from Chicago. His early influences in drumming were from his father and John Kirkwood Sr. from St. Catharines, Ontario. In 1975 Pipe Major Ian Swinton asked Jim to help form the new Midlothian Scottish Pipe Band. The band started in Grade 4 and placed third in their first contest. In 1985 the band was promoted to Grade 1 which finished one of the band's early goals which was to go from Grade 4 to Grade 1 in ten years using mostly players taught by Ian and Jim. Midlothian won many titles several times including the U.S. Open Championship, and the North American Championship and several placings in the top 6 at the World Championships.

Hugh Cameron (Final Round)

Hugh has been a professional drumming instructor for over 30 years and has taught throughout North America. He has over 20 years of experience in Grade 1 pipe bands as well as having won most solo drumming titles in Ontario, including three consecutive Champion Supreme awards for Professional solo drumming. Hugh has achieved an advanced certificate in pipe band drumming from the RSPBA, and from 1974 to 1986 was a student of the late Alex Duthart, later playing with his son, Drew, in the Toronto Police Pipe Band. Hugh owns Cameron's Drumming Studio, the largest distributor of Premier pipe band drums in North America.

The North American Gold Medal, 2.5 inches (6.5 cm) in diameter of gold-plated solid silver, featuring the MHAF logo on the obverse, and the Henderson's Pipe & Drum Supply logo on the reverse, will be awarded to the Winner in Scottish snare drumming.
