

The Thirteenth Annual McCallum Bagpipes & MidWest Pipe Band Association United States Silver Medal Piobaireachd Competition will be held January 9, 2015, at the Marriott-Country Club Plaza, in Kansas City. The contest will begin at approximately 8:00 a.m.

The McCallum & MWPBA Silver Medal (USA), 2.5 inches (6.5 cm) in diameter featuring the ancient MacCrimmon piper and "MidWest Pipe Band Association" on the obverse, and the MHAF logo on the reverse, will be awarded to the day's champion in Piobaireachd. Prize moneys include First winning USD \$500 through Fifth \$100. The Silver Medal Champion will also be awarded a set of Silver and Imitation Ivory pipes, courtesy of Kenny MacLeod and McCallum Bagpipes, with runners-up receiving McCallum McC² pipe chanters.

Open to pipers professional/open by their regional pipe band associations, the piper must submit four tunes of their own choice; Competitors will be notified of the selected tune prior to entering the final tuning-room.



Brian Donaldson was taught to play the pipes by his father, Pipe Major Andrew Donaldson, himself a renowned piper and teacher. As a young age Brian played with the world famous Dysart & Dundonald Pipe Band, winning all the major championships in Grade1. In 1978, Brian enlisted in the Scots Guards and served all over the world. He passed his Pipe Majors course at the Army School of Piping in 1982.

Brian has achieved an amazing list of prizes including the Gold Medal at Oban. Brian recently was appointed as Piping Instructor at St. John's Northwestern Military Academy in Delafield, Wisconsin.

Colin MacLellan

Colin MacLellan, a professional educator, has achieved much as both a bandsman and solo piper. Starting as Pipe Major of the 1986 Grade 4 Glengarry Pipe Band, he led the band to the 1996 Grade 2 North American and US Championships; the band was promoted to Grade 1 the following year. He was appointed Pipe Major of Edinburgh's storied Lothian and Borders Police Pipe Band in 1999, serving to 2004. Colin won the Gold Medal at the Northern Meeting in 1982, consecutive MacCrimmon Silver Chanters in 1990 and 1991, and the Gold Medal at the Argyllshire Gathering in 1992.

He served as President of the Competing Pipers Association from 1999 – 2004, and is featured on Lismor Recordings' "World's Greatest Pipers" volume 11. He was a member of 2008's Spirit of Scotland Pipe Band.



Ken Eller (Qualifying Round)

Ken Eller, also known as "The Captain", has had a 50 year piping career... 15 times a winner of the North American Pipe Band Championships with two bands: the 78th Fraser Highlanders and the Clan MacFarlane Pipe Band. He is now retired from active competition and has expanded his teaching career with on line lessons. In 2005 he was accepted by the Royal Scottish Pipe Band Association (RSPBA) to their panel as an international adjudicator.

Willie McCallum (Qualifying Round)

A native of Campbeltown, Kintyre, Willie received his main tuition from his uncles Ronald and Hugh. Willie's competitive record is impressive as he has won almost every prize in piping including the Highland Society of London Gold Medals at the Northern Meeting and Argyllshire Gathering, the Glenfiddich Championship 8 times, the senior Piobaireachd at the Argyllshire Gathering 3 times, the MSR Former Winners at the Argyllshire Gathering 5 times, the MSR for Former Winners at the Northern Meeting 4 times, the Bratach Gorm 3 times, the P/M Donald MacLeod Memorial 7 times, and the Dr. Dan Reid Memorial 7 times. He is in demand as a tutor and recitalist at home and abroad and in recent years, his pupils have gained major prizes at the piping gatherings at Oban, Inverness, Skye and London.

Roddy MacLeod, MBE (Final Round)

Roddy MacLeod, MBE is the Principal of The National Piping Centre. One of the world's most accomplished competitive solo pipers, he has won all of solo piping's most coveted awards, many of them several times over. He was Pipe Major of the Grade 1 ScottishPower Pipe Band from 1995 - 2005 during which time he led them to over forty-five Grade 1 Championship prizes in major competition including the Cowal Championships and the All-Ireland Championship. In 2008 he led the Spirit of Scotland Pipe Band to the final of Grade 1 at the World Pipe Band Championships after bringing together a group of the world's top solo pipers and drummers together for a short period of intensive practice. Roddy is also a Director and a Founder of Piping Live!, Glasgow's International Piping Festival.

Donald McBride (Final Round)

Donald McBride was taught originally by his father Willie McBride, and studied piobaireachd under Donald MacPherson. In the 1970s, he played in the Muirhead & Sons Pipe Band under P/M Robert G. Hardie. When he returned to Scotland in 1996 until he moved to County Donegal in 2004, Donald took piobaireachd lessons from Andrew Wright. During his competitive career Donald was a perennial prizewinner at the Argyllshire Gathering and the Northern Meeting, including winning the A Grade March there in 1982.

Midwest Highland Arts Fund North American Amateur Ceol Beag Championships

judges Terry Lee (Grade 1)

Pipe Major Terry Lee is one of the most prominent and successful pipe band leaders in the world. Under his direction, the SFU Pipe Band captured the World Pipe Band Championship of 1995, 1996, 1999, 2001, 2008 and 2009, and is one of only two bands in history to win both the Medley and MSR events at the World Championships more than once (MSR five times, Medley five times). Terry is also one of only seven Pipe Majors to win the World Championship more than twice.

His ability to produce superb band performances in both the contemporary and traditional style, and to significantly enhance the musicality and technique of his players is respected worldwide. Terry serves as General Manager of the well-known Scottish supplies store, Tartantown. On September 10, 1999 P/M Terry Lee and P/S Jack Lee were each presented with Canada's Meritorious Service Medal by Governor General Romeo LeBlanc in Quebec City, Quebec.

Chris Apps (Grades 2)

Keith Paton (Grades 3)

Keith is a native of Kansas City and grew up playing in the Kansas City St. Andrew Pipe Band. Since moving to Seattle in 1994, Keith has been active in the Pacific Northwest piping community. From 1997 to 1999 he played with the Abbotsford Police Pipe Band, competing with the band twice in Grade 1 at the World Pipe Band Championships. Subsequently he joined the Simon Fraser University Pipe Band playing with SFU from 2000 to 2006, and then again from 2010 to 2014.

He is an active adjudicator at piping competitions throughout the U.S. Pacific Northwest and serves on the BCPA grading committee. He is an educator by profession, and he has been a private and group piping instructor for students of all ages for more than 30 years.

The Midwest Highland Arts Fund North American Amateur Ceol Beag Championships will be held January 10, 2014 at the Marriott - Country Club Plaza, in Kansas City.

The age of the Competitor in Amateur Grades 1, 2, and 3 will not be restricted. Depending upon the grade, the Competitor must submit an MSR or an MSRHJ. Pipers placing First through Third in the three grades will win the MHAF North American Amateur Medal. Minted with the Gold Medal, the bronze medals are 2.5 inches (6.5 cm) in diameter, featuring the MHAF logo. In addition, pipers placing First through Third in the three grades will be awarded a custom made pipe bag of their choice from Lee & Sons Bagpipes.
