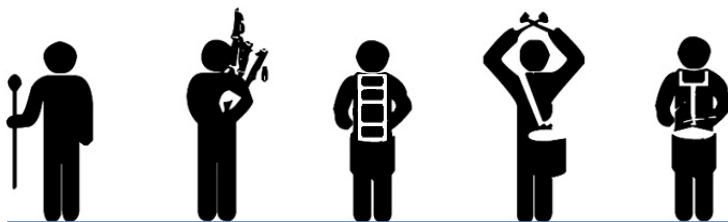

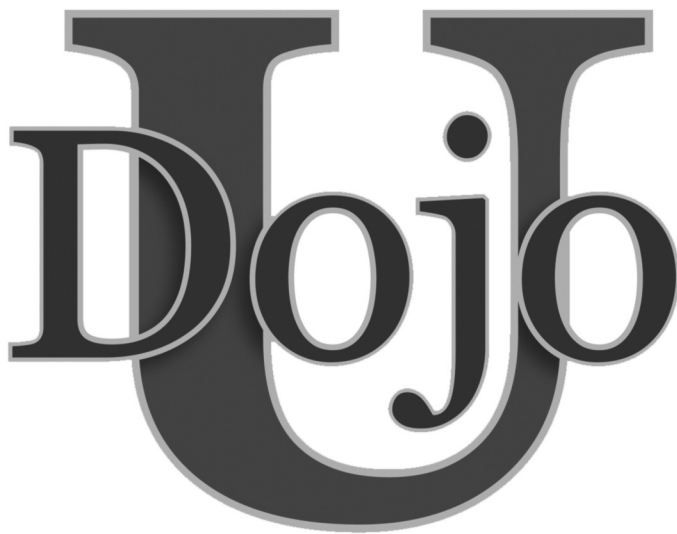

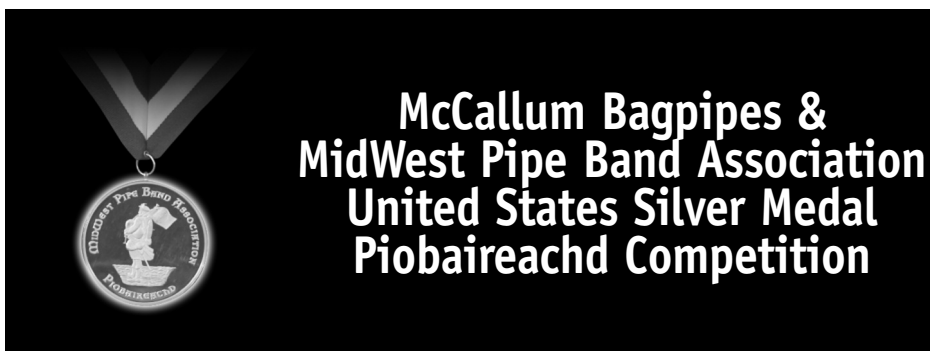

Ian K. MacDonald

Ian began playing at the age of eight years old and was taught by his father, P/M John MacDonald.

At thirteen he received piobaireachd instruction from Jim McGillivray. That same year he joined the Toronto Police Pipe Band where he has remained a member, eventually taking over as Pipe Major from his father in 1996.

In 2016 Ian became the twelfth piper in history to win the "Double" Gold medal in Piobaireachd at Oban and Inverness.

Fred Morrison

Combining the Gaelic piping tradition of the Uists with contemporary influences, Fred has carved an international reputation on the Highland, bellows blown, and uilleann pipes and the low whistle with a powerfully exuberant, highly improvisational style.

His prowess on the Highland pipes gained him honors including the Gold Medals at Oban and Inverness, and the prestigious Macallan trophy at Brittany's Lorient Celtic Festival no fewer than seven times.

Voted 2004's "Instrumentalist of the Year" by the Scots Trad Music Awards, Fred's stature as a musician was recognized by Glasgow's Celtic Connections festival in 2005, when he was commissioned to write the grand opening composition.

about the silver medal

The Fifteenth Annual McCallum Bagpipes & Midwest Pipe Band Association United States Silver Medal Piobaireachd Competition will be held January 13, 2017, at the Marriott-Country Club Plaza, in Kansas City. The contest will begin at approximately 8:00 a.m.

The McCallum & MWPBA Silver Medal (USA), 2.5 inches (6.5 cm) in diameter featuring the ancient MacCrimmon piper and "MidWest Pipe Band Association" on the obverse, and the MHAF logo on the reverse, will be awarded to the day's champion in Piobaireachd. Prize moneys include First winning USD \$500 through Fifth \$100. The Silver Medal Champion will also be awarded a set of Duncan MacRae Bagpipes (developed by Stuart Liddell and McCallum Bagpipes), courtesy of Kenny MacLeod and McCallum Bagpipes, with runners-up receiving McCallum McC² pipe chanters. New this year, prizewinners will also receive a one-year membership to the College of Piping in Glasgow.

Open to pipers professional/open by their regional pipe band associations, the piper must submit four tunes of their own choice; Competitors will be notified of the selected tune prior to entering the final tuning-room.

The contest, unique in North America, will be held just before the 16th Annual MHAF Winter Storm Weekend, January 13 – 15, and that Saturday evening's WINTER STORM 2017: The Pipes & Drums Concert, performed by the workshop faculty; the Champion will also be invited to perform with the winners of the R.G. Hardie – MHAF Gold Medal Piobaireachd Competition, the Henderson's Pipe & Drum Supply – MHAF North American Gold Medal Drumming Championship, the MHAF Gold Medal Tenor Drumming Championship, the Princeton Reimbursement Group – MHAF Gold Medal Bass Drumming Championship, and the Henderson's Pipe & Drum Supply – MHAF North American Gold Medal Ceol Beag Competition.

Callum Beaumont

Callum Beaumont has won almost every major soloist prize and recently became the youngest piper in history to win the Clasp. He has also earned both Highland Society of London Gold Medals, and was the champion piper at the 2014 London events. Callum lives in Linlithgow, West Lothian and is a piping instructor at Dollar Academy.

In addition to his solo piping success, Callum has won the World Pipe Band Championships with Simon Fraser University Pipe Band and Shotts & Dykehead Pipe Band.

Brian Donaldson

Brian Donaldson was taught to play the pipes by his father, Pipe Major Andrew Donaldson, himself a renowned piper and teacher. As a young age Brian played with the world famous Dysart & Dundonald Pipe Band, winning all the major championships in Grade 1. In 1978, Brian enlisted in the Scots Guards and served all over the world. He passed his Pipe Majors course at the Army School of Piping in 1982.

Brian has achieved an amazing list of prizes including the Gold Medal at Oban. Brian recently was appointed as Piping Instructor at St. John's Northwestern Military Academy in Delafield, Wisconsin.

The R.G. Hardie & Co. – MHAFF Gold Medal (USA), 2.5 inches (6.5 cm) in diameter of gold-plated silver featuring the MHAFF logo on the obverse, will be awarded to the day's Champion in Piobaireachd. Prize moneys include First winning USD \$750, Second \$500, and Third \$250. New this year, prizewinners will also receive a one-year membership to the College of Piping in Glasgow.

Competitors must be eligible to apply for the Gold Medal competitions at Oban or Inverness, or be prior winners of the McCallum Bagpipes-MWPBA Silver Medal. Competitors must submit four tunes of their own choice. Competitors will be notified of the selected tune prior to entering the final tuning-room.

Henderson's Pipe & Drum Supply – Midwest Highland Arts Fund North American Gold Medal Ceol Beag Competition

judges

Ken Eller (Qualifying Round)

Ken Eller, also known as "The Captain", has had a 50 year piping career... 15 times a winner of the North American Pipe Band Championships with two bands: the 78th Fraser Highlanders and the Clan MacFarlane Pipe Band. He is now retired from active competition and has expanded his teaching career with on line lessons. In 2005 he was accepted by the Royal Scottish Pipe Band Association (RSPBA) to their panel as an international adjudicator.

Terry Tully (Qualifying Round)

An award-winning piper in his own right, Terry is best known at the Pipe Major of the St. Laurence O'Toole Pipe Band. With Terry at the helm, in 2008, the band won the Scottish and British Championships, and was runner-up in the European and Cowal Championships and placed 5th overall at the World Championships, winning the Champion of Champions in Grade 1. In 2010, the band's 100th year, the band won the World, European and All-Ireland Championships.

Terry has authored several widely-acclaimed books of traditional Irish Music arranged for the Highland bagpipe, and his name has become virtually synonymous with traditional Irish Music in the world of bagpipes.

Colin MacLellan (Final Round)

Colin MacLellan is the Director of Piping at the College of Piping in Glasgow. Starting as Pipe Major of the 1986 Grade 4 Glengarry Pipe Band, he led the band to the 1996 Grade 2 North American and US Championships; the band was promoted to Grade 1 the following year. He was appointed Pipe Major of Edinburgh's storied Lothian and Borders Police Pipe Band in 1999, serving to 2004. Colin won the Gold Medal at the Northern Meeting in 1982, consecutive MacCrimmon Silver Chanters in 1990 and 1991, and the Gold Medal at the Argyllshire Gathering in 1992. He served as President of the Competing Pipers Association from 1999 – 2004, and is featured on Lismor Recordings' "World's Greatest Pipers" volume 11. He is a member of the Spirit of Scotland Pipe Band.

Richard Parkes, MBE (Final Round)

Richard has been Pipe Major of 11-time World Champion Field Marshal Montgomery Pipe Band since 1981, making history by leading FMM to become the most successful pipe band ever to come from Northern Ireland. Richard was honored with an MBE from Her Majesty The Queen in 2004 for recognition of his services to pipe band music in Northern Ireland. Although Richard has always put the band first, he also managed to win 7 All Ireland Senior Solo Championships, eight Northern Ireland Piper of the Year titles, nine Ulster Senior Championships, as well as winning the Strachan in London, the Jig in Inverness and a number of other prizes at major solo competitions.

The Henderson's Pipe & Drum Supply – MHAF Gold Medal (USA), 2.5 inches (6.5 cm) in diameter of gold plated silver featuring the Henderson logo on the obverse, and the MHAF logo on the reverse, will be awarded to the day's Champion. Prize moneys include First winning USD \$750, Second \$500, and Third \$250. New this year, prizewinners will also receive a one-year membership to the College of Piping in Glasgow.

Pipers graded B or higher, or Open/Professional by their Pipe Band Association are eligible to compete. Alex MacIntyre (Grade 1)

Alex MacIntyre is the former Pipe Major of the Grade 1 Alberta Caledonia Pipe Band, a perennial prizewinner in Canada and at the World Pipe Band Championships. Alex is a former instructor at the Coeur D' Alene, Idaho piping school and has judged solo and band competitions throughout Canada and the United States for over thirty years.

Terry Lee (Grade 2 and 3)

Pipe Major Terry Lee is one of the most prominent and successful pipe band leaders in the world. Under his direction, the SFU Pipe Band captured the World Pipe Band Championship of 1995, 1996, 1999, 2001, 2008 and 2009, and is one of only two bands in history to win both the Medley and MSR events at the World Championships more than once (MSR five times, Medley five times). His ability to produce superb band performances in both the contemporary and traditional style, and to significantly enhance the musicality and technique of his players is respected worldwide. Terry serves as General Manager of the well-known Scottish supplies store, Tartantown. On September 10, 1999 P/M Terry Lee and P/S Jack Lee were each presented with Canada's Meritorious Service Medal by Governor General Romeo LeBlanc in Quebec City, Quebec.

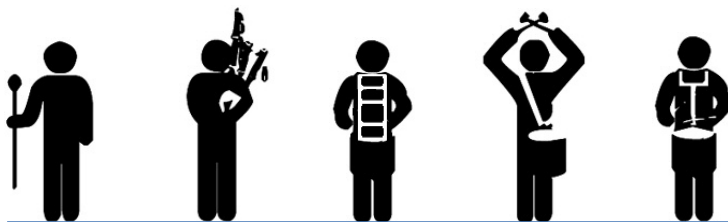

Duncan Millar (Qualifying Round)

Duncan has played with the Simon Fraser University Pipe Band since 1997 and helped the band win four World Pipe Band Championship titles since then, including four Best Drum Corps titles in 1999, 2004, 2008 and 2009. The winner of many solo drumming prizes, Duncan has appeared in the final round at the World Solo Drumming Championships multiple times.

Doug Stronach (Qualifying Round)

An accredited judge and Music Board member of the Pipers and Pipe Band Society of Ontario, Doug holds the highest level certificate in drumming from the combined Royal Scottish Pipe Band Association, the Army School of Piping and Drumming, and the Institute of Piping, known collectively as the Piping and Drumming Qualifications Board.

Jim Sim (Qualifying Round)

Jim started drumming lessons with his Father at the age of 8. His first band was the Stock Yard Kilty Band from Chicago. His early influences in drumming were from his father and John Kirkwood Sr. from St. Catharines, Ontario. In 1975 Pipe Major Ian Swinton asked Jim to help form the new Midlothian Scottish Pipe Band.
