

#### HOW REDUCING REHOSPITALIZATIONS IMPACTS REVENUE AND

MARGINS: The SNF-VBP readmission penalties will become effective October 2018 based on calendar year 2017 SNFRM measure performance. CMS has locked down half of the policy components, and has left three critical areas to be decided in the 2017 final rule. In this session, James Mueller and Marinela Shqina will present the likely policy configurations; what aspects of readmission performance the SNFRM measures; model the likely relationship between SNFRM rates and reimbursement and margins; show the context of the policy in the acute-post-acute continuum of care; and discuss business and quality improvement strategies helpful in navigating the new environment.

This presentation will look at VPN from both the reimbursement policy perspective, and the provider business strategy perspective.

#### SEXUALITY AND NURSING HOMES: STRANGE BEDFELLOWS:

Older adults who may wish to have intimate relationships already have two strikes against them because most people believe that older adults are asexual or if they aren't, should be. How do nursing homes and other residential living environments impair the ability for residents to have intimate relationships? Adult children of older residents tend to be the ones making determinations about their parent's sexuality while in the nursing home. How could education be offered for families and staff that will allow the possibility of continued interest in intimacy? When is sexual expression appropriate and when is it not? How can staff determine if resident to resident sexual expression is abusive? How could staff policies and education improve resident quality of life? 



#### A Brief KHCA History. . .

In January of 1951, a group of nursing home operators from Wichita headed by Estelle Biffer and Norma Summers decided to organize the Sedgwick County Association of Licensed Nursing Homes and proceeded to elect Mae Hull as its first President. In April, these three went to the Missouri State Convention to get ideas for a State Organization. At this time, they found that Shawnee County had also organized.

In May of 1951 a meeting was called for all licensed operators in the state. There were fifty people present at the organizational meeting held in Wichita and forty-two people became

members on that day.

On July 5, 1951, the organization was incorporated. In August the first educational meeting for administrators was held in Wichita. In September, Mrs. Biffer went to Boston, Massachusetts to attend the Second Annual Convention of the American Association of Nursing Homes. Upon her recommendation, the Kansas Association affiliated with the American Association of Nursing Homes in October of 1951. The first state convention was held at the Allis Hotel in Wichita on October 15, 1951. At that time, Estelle Biffer was elected President, an office she held for four years. Other officers elected at that first convention were:

1st Vice President - Robert Freeman, MD, Oskaloosa

2nd Vice President - Ona Selph, Topeka Secretary - Norma Summers, Wichita Treasurer - Mrs. Myron Hull, Wichita

The first executive secretary was hired for the Association in 1956. In 1959, the name of the association was changed to Kansas Nursing Home Association, Inc., the same year the Association opened its first office in Topeka.

On April 1, 1972 the Association moved to its present offices at 1301 South Topeka Blvd., Topeka. Following the National affiliate in 1975 the Association again changed its name to the

present Kansas Health Care Association, Inc.
